Those who are 5th grade and older, baptized into Christ, and believe Christ's promise that he is truly present with grace and forgiveness as he promised are invited to hold out your hands for Communion. IF YOU BELIEVE BUT ARE NOT BAPTIZED OR INSTRUCTED IN CHRIST, COME TO THE TABLE ALSO AND BOW YOUR HEAD TO RECEIVE A PASTORAL BLESSING. PLEASE SPEAK TO A PASTOR AFTER WORSHIP ABOUT PREPARATION FOR BAPTISM.

About the red wine: Though Jesus himself drank wine, white grape juice is provided in the middle of each tray for those who, for any reason, need it.

Before you Commune or when you return to your seat after receiving Holy Communion, please 1) consider kneeling for personal prayers and/or 2) reverently sing songs or be silently considerate of those still Communing or praying, i.e. please, no idle conversation.

TODAY'S BIBLE READINGS NOTES: Conflict is a part of relationships and life in community. Jesus' words in today's gospel are often used in situations having to do with church discipline. The prophet Ezekiel tells of warning the wicked to turn from their ways, and Paul reminds us that love is the fulfilling of the law. We gather in the name of Christ, assured that he is present among us with gifts of peace and reconciliations.

PASTOR: Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your people... Congregation: And kindle in us the fire of your love!

"For God so loved the world that he gave His only begotten Son that whosoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." John 3:16

BRIEF ORDER for CONFESSION of SIN and FORGIVENESS:

We confess our sinful nature and our actual sins and speak to one another the forgiveness in Jesus' name that the Lord would have us all speak to any who are sorry for their sin.

The invocation and call to confession of sin, then SILENCE FOR SELF-EXAMINATION. Leader: Let us now confess our sin to God our Father together.

All: Most merciful God, we confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean. We have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved You with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We justly deserve Your present and eternal punishment.

For the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in Your will and walk in Your way to the glory of Your holy name. Amen.

Leader: Almighty God in his mercy has given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a servant of Christ, and by His authority, I announce to you the good news that all your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen. And to you, upon this your confession and our calling as disciples of Jesus Christ, we announce to you the good news that all your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

THE FIRST LESSON: Ezekiel 33:7-11

The Introduction: God appointed Ezekiel as a sentinel for the house of Israel. Ezekiel must faithfully convey God's warnings to the people. Remarkably, God – who is about to attack Jerusalem – gives a warning with the hope that repentance will make the attack unnecessary.

The Reading:

⁷"Now as for you, son of man, I have appointed you a watchman for the house of Israel; so you will hear a message from My mouth and give them warning from Me. ⁸ When I say to the wicked, 'O wicked man, you will surely die,' and you do not speak to warn the wicked from his way, that wicked man shall die in his iniquity, but his blood I will require from your hand. ⁹ But if you on your part warn a wicked man to turn from his way and he does not turn from his way, he will die in his iniquity, but you have delivered your life.

¹⁰ "Now as for you, son of man, say to the house of Israel, 'Thus you have spoken, saying, "Surely our transgressions and our sins are upon us, and we are rotting away in them; how then can we survive?"' ¹¹Say to them, 'As I live!' declares the Lord GOD, 'I take no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but rather that the wicked turn from his way and live. Turn back, turn back from your evil ways! Why then will you die, O house of Israel?'"

(Lector: "This is the word of the Lord!" then, all, "Thanks be to God!")

☐ THE PSALM: Psalm 119:33-40 (Congregation sings verses in bold) Teach me, O LORD, the way ' of your statutes,* and I shall keep it ' to the end. ³⁴ Give me understanding, and I shall ' keep your teaching;* I shall keep it with ' all my heart. ³⁵ Lead me in the path of ' your commandments,* for that is ' my desire. ³⁶ Incline my heart to ' your decrees* and not to ' unjust gain. ³⁷ Turn my eyes from be- ' holding falsehood;* give me life ' in your way. ³⁸ Fulfill your promise ' to your servant,* which is for ' those who fear you. ³⁹ Turn away the reproach ' that I dread,* because your judg- ' ments are good. 40 Behold, I long for ' your commandments;* by your righteousness en- ' liven me.

THE SECOND LESSON: Romans 13:8-14

The Introduction: The obligation of Christians is to love one another and so fulfill the heart and goal of the law. Clothes make the person as we "put on the Lord Jesus Christ" and live today in light of the future God has in store for us.

The Reading:

⁸Owe nothing to anyone except to love one another; for he who loves his neighbor has fulfilled the law. ⁹For this, "You shall not commit adultery, You shall not murder, You shall not steal, You shall not covet," and if there is any other commandment, it is summed up in this saying, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." ¹⁰Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfillment of the law.

¹¹ Do this, knowing the time, that it

is already the hour for you to awaken from sleep; for now salvation is nearer to us than when we believed. ¹² The night is almost gone, and the day is near. Therefore let us lay aside the deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light. ¹³ Let us behave properly as in the day, not in carousing and drunkenness, not in sexual promiscuity and sensuality, not in strife and jealousy. ¹⁴ But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh in regard to its lusts.
